# **Curriculum Development and Delivery:**

<u>Introduction to Set Design:</u> redeveloped curriculum in 2013 to focus on a broader interpretation of scenic design, through the lenses of relationships between designer and director, narrative, audience and space. This course is taught in 2<sup>nd</sup> year Theatre Production.

<u>Production Applications:</u> Delivered from 2003 to April 2017. Production Applications provides students with applied experience in all aspects of theatre production through hands-on responsibilities in department productions. As well as the role of instruction in the scenic paint and properties departments, on going curriculum development includes:

- Development of Job Shadow program
- Development of journal techniques that place emphasis on self-guided learning and meta-cognition
- Development of Leadership modules in 2<sup>nd</sup> year
- Development of evaluation rubrics

<u>Introduction to Puppetry:</u> developed as a new course in the Theatre Production and Performance departments in January 2009. The focus of this course is on the collaborative nature of the ensemble creation through the art of puppetry. The students learn how to design, build, manipulate, and create original performances in puppetry and performing objects, in an open environment of exploration. This course is taught to both 2<sup>nd</sup> year performance and production students.

<u>Introduction to Theatre:</u> redevelopment of curriculum in 2006. Delivery from 2006 to 2013. This course introduces beginning performance and production students to the theory and practice of theatre within the landscape of contemporary Canadian arts and culture, with an emphasis on the exploration and understanding of collaborative and creative processes as they apply to the performing arts.

<u>Drafting:</u> Delivered from 2003 to 2008. This course is an introduction to the basic techniques of accurately representing sets and objects graphically for construction in a theatre workshop, while also developing skills in reading and understanding working drawings.

<u>Visual Communications</u>: Delivered from 2010 to 2013. This course builds on the skills learned in Drafting and focuses on the means of expressing ideas in graphic and visual forms that are relevant to theatrical design and production purposes. Students learn advanced drafting techniques, perspective drawing, colour rendering, and sketching techniques.

<u>Scenic Paint 1</u>: Delivered from 2003 to 2012. This course is an introduction to the basic techniques of scenery painting through practical application. Students learn basic colour theory, basic brush techniques and a variety of applications, i.e. bricks, field stones, marble, granite, wood grain, highlights and shadows.

<u>Properties 1:</u> Developed curriculum and delivered from 2003 to 2017. This course is an introduction to the many considerations and demands necessary for properties construction. Through hands-on experimentation, the student is introduced to the basic knowledge and experience of working with some of the materials and methods used in the construction of theatrical props. Through group discussions the student learns to evaluate the criteria for building successful stage properties.

<u>Properties 2:</u> Expanded curriculum from Properties 1 in 2005. Delivered from 2005 to 2017. Building upon the basics learned in Properties 1, this course allows the student to further explore the materials and methods of theatrical properties building, as well as develop skills and knowledge pertaining to time and material budgeting, while building practical projects for portfolio presentation.

#### Abstract:

This project looks specifically at the post secondary college environment in terms of creativity and education, through an examination of its various relationships in art, culture, and society.

Chapter one examines the pedagogical challenges that present themselves in the classroom, considering the relationship between the teacher and the organizational structures of the post secondary educational environment, as well as the structures within our cultural industries. Chapter two further investigates the role that creativity plays in the relationship between education and culture. Through this examination, some questions are addressed as to how and why we measure and evaluate, how we organize our educational structures, and the ultimate purpose of art education for our current culture. Chapter three focuses on the role that creativity plays in the relationship between art and culture through an examination of my own creative process. The final chapter examines topics for further research relative to the overall themes of wholeness, value and context, which are woven throughout this thesis. Suggestions are provided for directions of further research in transdisciplinary education.
